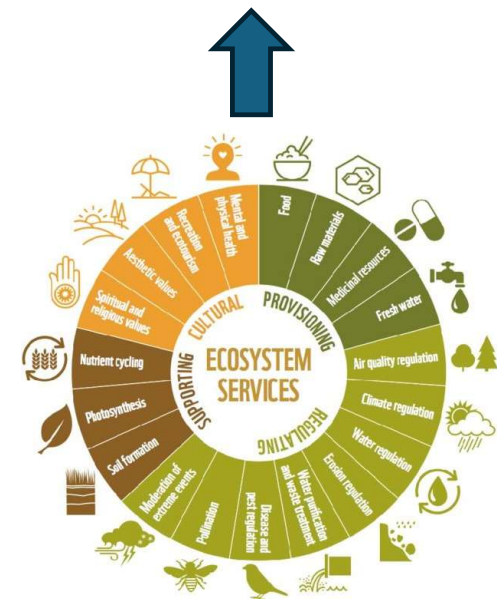

UNCCD Global Land Outlook: Rangelands and Pastoralists



- People-centered and rights-based framework for understanding and investing in rangeland health and sustainable pastoralism
- Integration of livelihoods, extensive livestock production, regional economies, and national development priorities
- Policy-relevant narrative and legal frameworks for inclusive governance/management approaches
- More than 60 case studies from around the world: learning from the past and planning for the future

UNCCD COP Decision on Rangelands and Pastoralists

Decision 29/COP.16 (2024) represents a commitment by 196 countries and the EU to protect rangelands and the communities that depend on them.

Countries pledged to increase their efforts to conserve, sustainably manage, and restore their rangelands and report progress at COP17, which will be hosted by Mongolia from 17-28 August 2026.

This COP decision represents a fundamental shift, placing rangelands alongside croplands, forests, and wetlands in global sustainability efforts ...

... and fully recognizing the role of pastoralist systems in enhancing climate resilience, biodiversity conservation and food security.

National Priorities Identified by the UNCCD COP

Recognizing the essential role of healthy rangelands in addressing key challenges related to livelihoods, cultural survival, food security, desertification, land degradation and drought, biodiversity loss, and climate change, Parties are invited to:

- prioritize policies and investments for the sustainable management of rangelands,
- foster an enabling environment for responsible and inclusive governance,
- improve tenure security in rangelands in line with the VGGT.



UNCCD Work Programme

The secretariat and the Global Mechanism are requested to work with partners to support Parties with:

- awareness-raising, capacity-building and resource mobilization;
- inclusive, community-based and participatory approaches that meaningfully engage pastoralist and other rangeland communities, including Indigenous Peoples and local communities;
- the development of initiatives for sustainable rangeland management, restoration and conservation through, inter alia, multi-stakeholder dialogues and national consultations (e.g., Flagship Initiative).



Next Steps – COP17

UNCCD COP17 in Mongolia will bring together many diverse rangeland constituencies to celebrate the IYRP and the completion of the Silk Road Journey -- with significant NGO/CSO and high-level representation.

While the agenda is still being finalized, rangelands and pastoralists are expected to feature prominently in numerous COP17 spaces, including special events and interactive dialogues.

Once the schedule becomes available, partners will be invited to help shape the discussions on the next steps for the convention, including modalities for partnerships to leverage technical and financial resources.

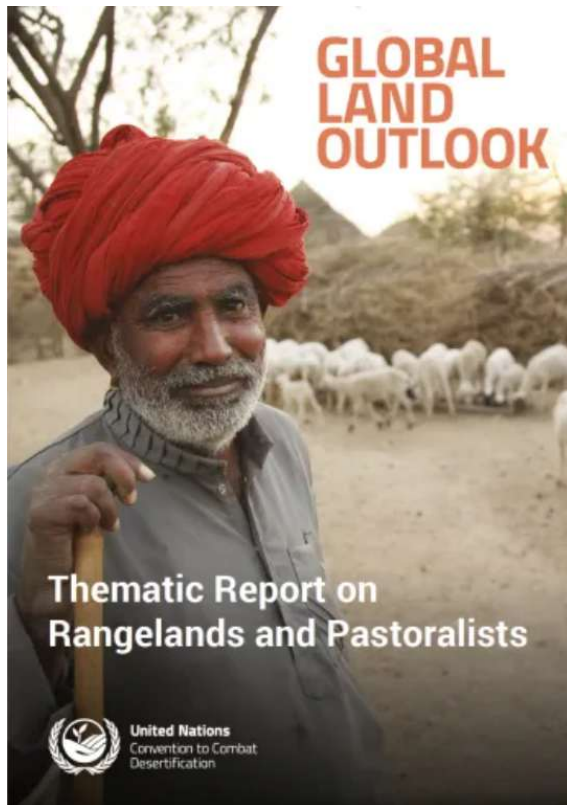

The Initiative will be launched at UNCCD COP17 in Mongolia during the International Year on Rangelands and Pastoralists (2026)

Impacts:

- Sustainable development in rangelands, including:
 - Poverty reduction, livelihood resilience, food security, one health, peace and stability
- Synergy between combatting desertification, conserving biodiversity, and mitigating & adapting to climate change

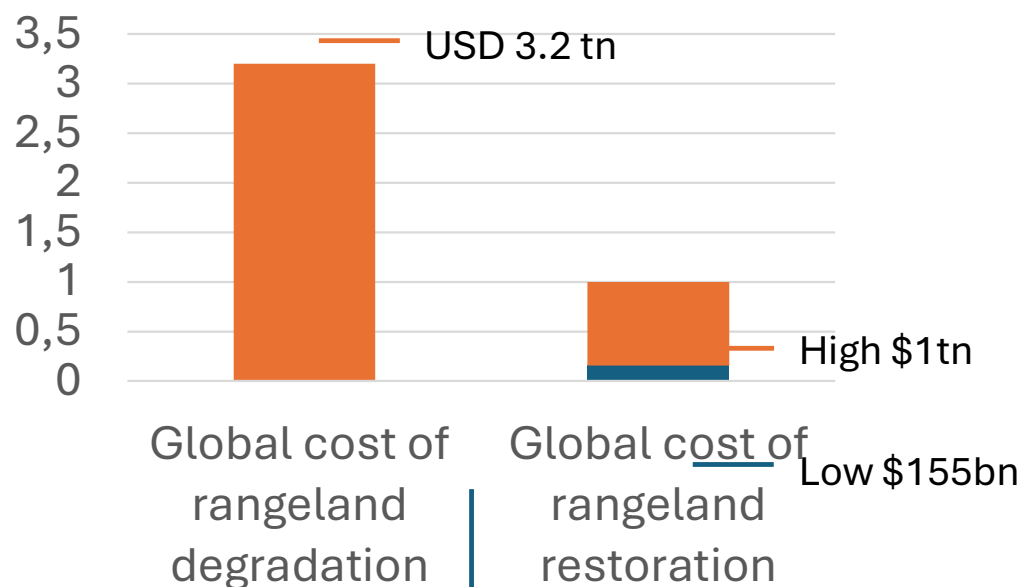

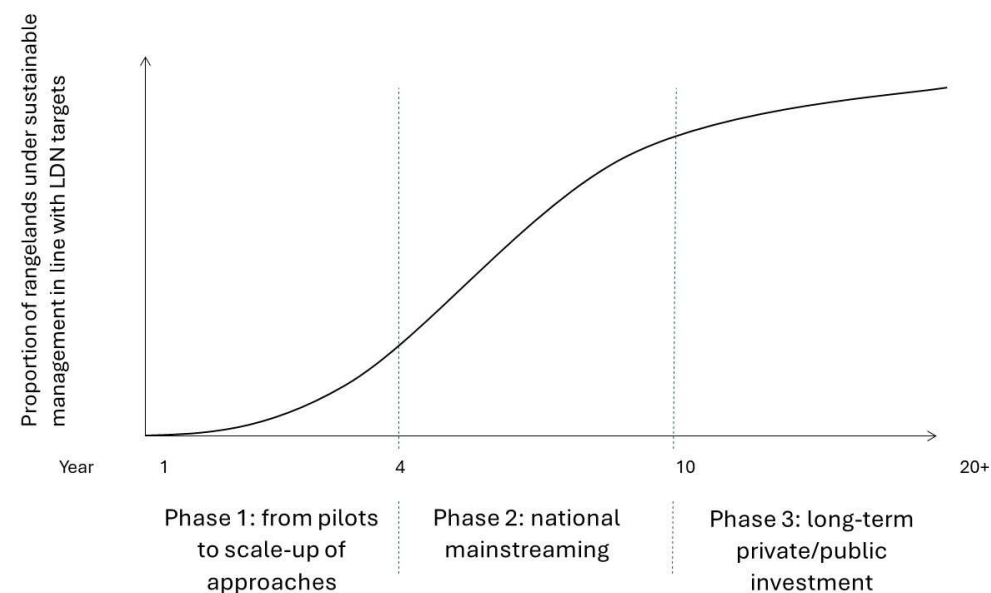

- ❖ Starts in Riyadh (COP16 host) and finishes in Ulaanbaatar on COP17 opening day

- ❖ Small core team travelling, others join per leg
- ❖ Route follows historic Silk Road and includes several former UNCCD COP/CRIC host countries

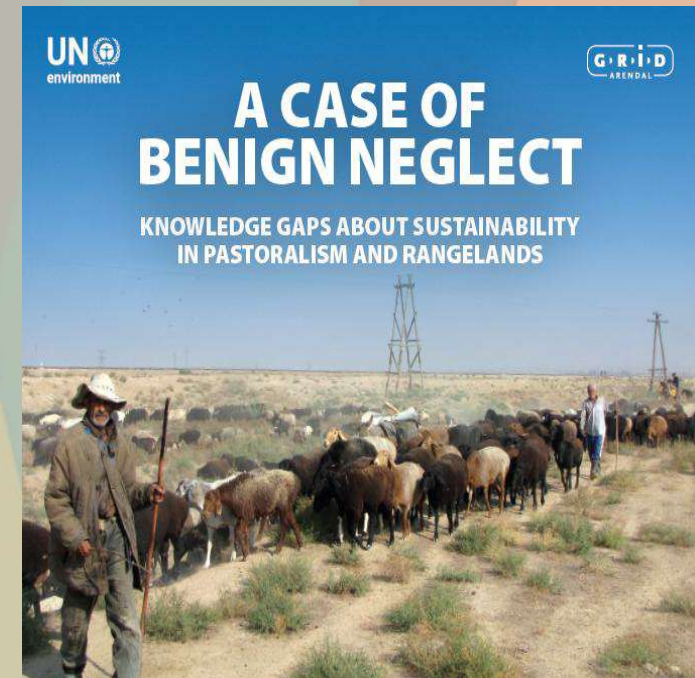

*Changing Paradigms:

- *Poorly understood and under valued cultures and ecosystems*

- *Lack of governmental visibility / weak support*
- *Prestige of pastoralists, pastoralism and their products*
- *Market-dependent. Mostly classified as “Price Takers”*
- *Market driven policies, and incomes depending on prices.*

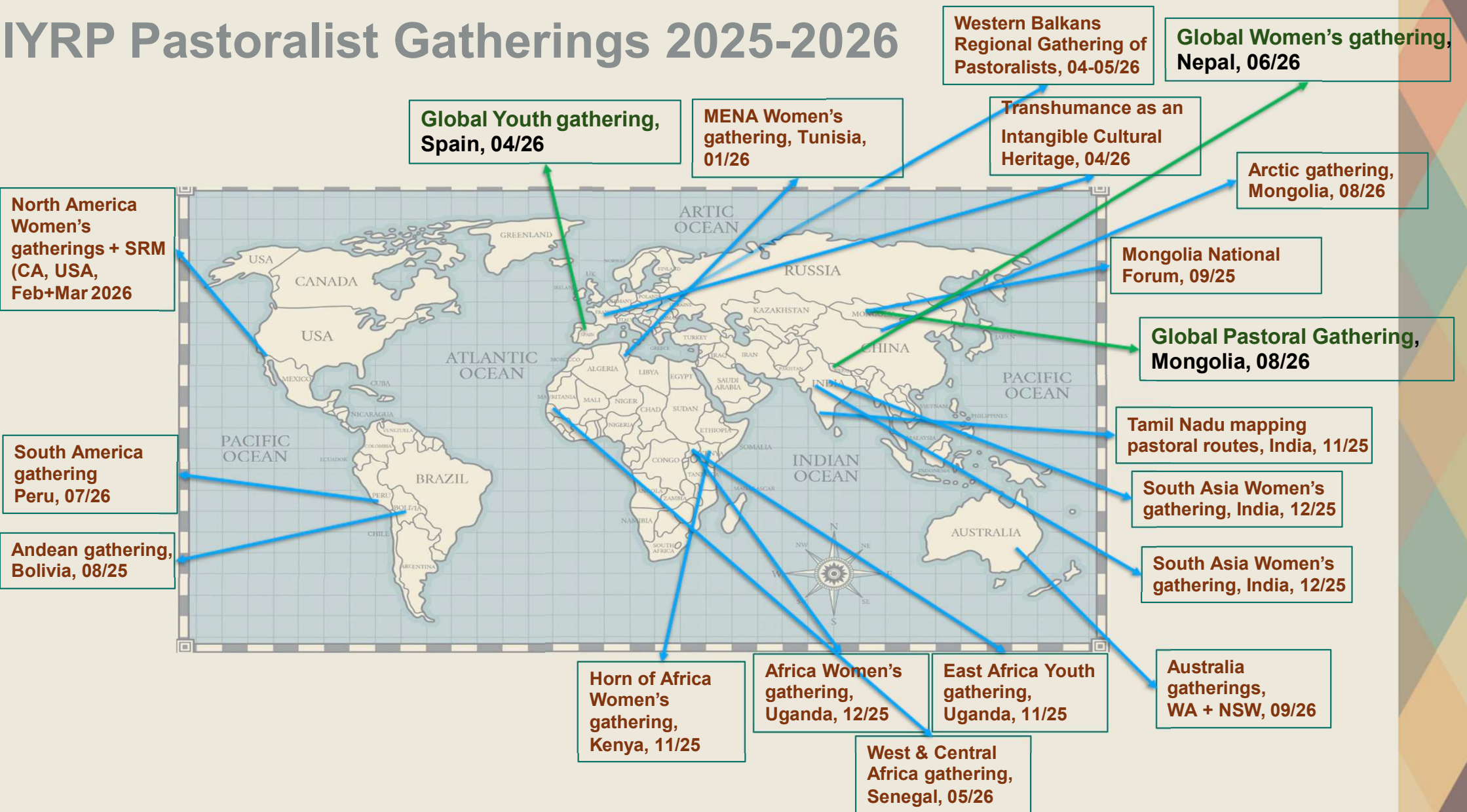

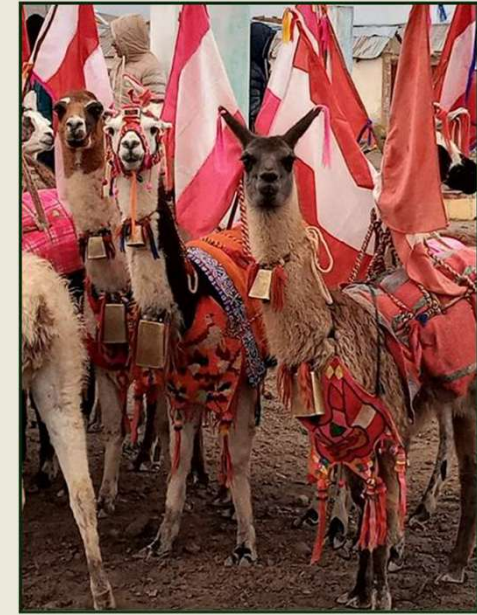

The Challenge: Why Rangelands Matter in Brasil

No Brasil identificamos cerca de seis Povos e Comunidades Locais com identidades, modos de vida e produção próprias e que podem globalmente ser compreendidas como pastores.

Suas práticas de gestão territorial contribuem para conservação da biodiversidade, solos, água e produção de alimentos saudáveis.

Ao mesmo tempo, o Brasil é líder global na exportação de carne bovina em 2025, com recorde histórico de 3,5 milhões de toneladas.

Our Policy Response: Brazil National Rangeland Strategy & Integration into LDN

- **Policy adopted:**

Decreto 6.040/2007 – Institui a Política Nacional de Desenvolvimento Sustentável dos Povos e Comunidades Tradicionais.

Decreto 11.815/2023 – Institui o Programa Nacional de Conversão de Pastagens Degradadas em Sistemas de Produção Agropecuários e Florestais Sustentáveis

- **Key commitments:**

Reconhecimento, fortalecimento e garantia dos seus direitos territoriais, sociais, ambientais, econômicos e culturais, com respeito e valorização à sua identidade, suas formas de organização e suas instituições.

- **Link to LDN:**

A garantia dos territórios e a conservação das terras pelos povos e comunidades tradicionais é um caminho para evitar a degradação da terra.

O PNCPD evita o desmatamento e a degradação, e contribui para restaurar áreas degradadas.

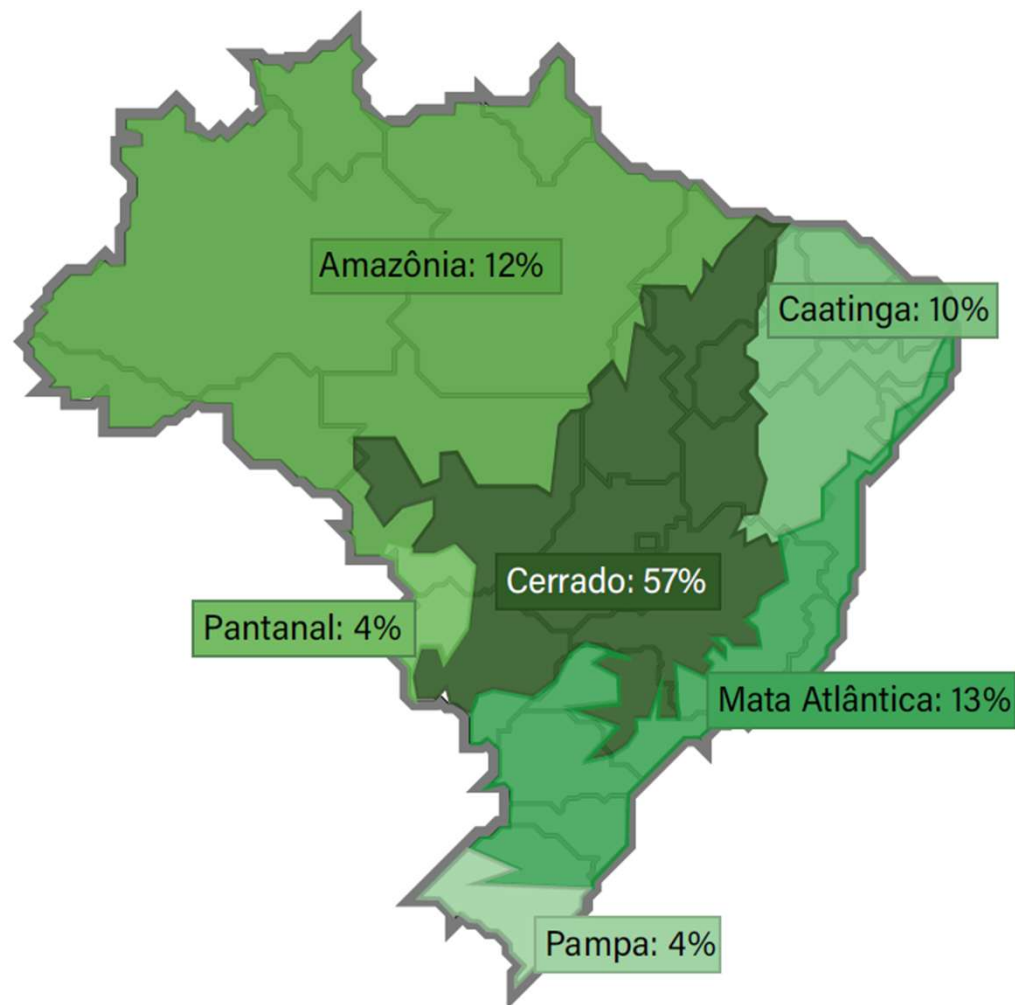
- O Governo Federal está empenhado na construção de mecanismos para demarcação e titulação dos territórios de Povos Indígenas e de Povos e Comunidades Tradicionais
- Projeto Redes pela Conservação para a redução do desmatamento nos biomas Cerrado, Caatinga, Pantanal, Mata Atlântica e Pampa, apoiando a implementação dos PPCDs - 32.259.000 EUR para 9 mi/ha em processo de conservação (Governo Alemão)

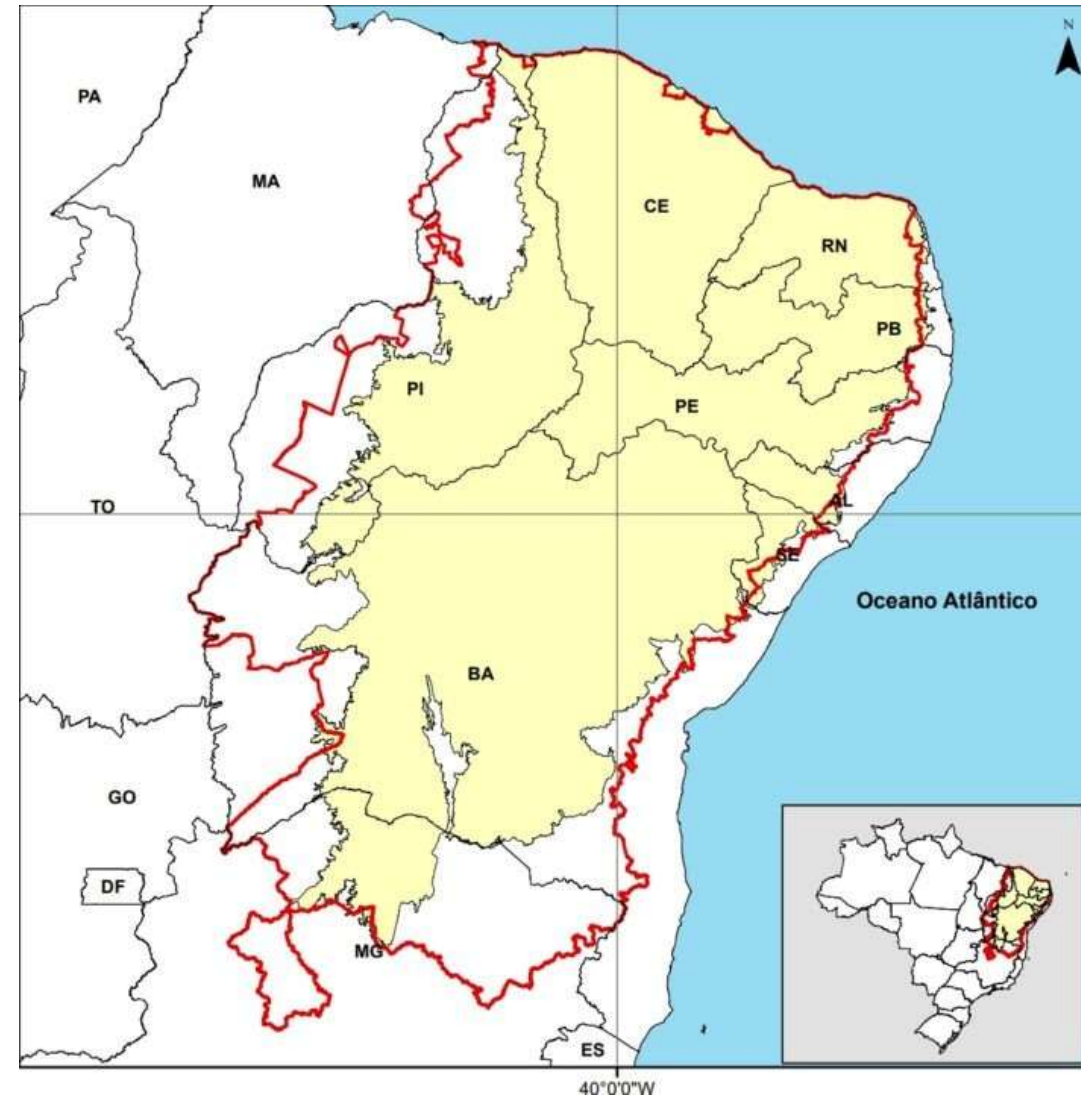
Pathways to Scale: Policy → Finance → Results

- O Programa Caminho Verde Brasil pretende recuperar 40 milhões de hectares de áreas degradadas para uso em sistemas de produção agropecuária e florestal sustentáveis no período de dez anos.
- 2º Leilão o Eco Invest Brasil destinou R\$ 30,2 bilhões para financiar os produtores que aderirem ao Caminho Verde Brasil - restaurar até 3 milhões de hectares de terras degradadas.
- R\$ 20 bilhões Caatinga e Cerrado

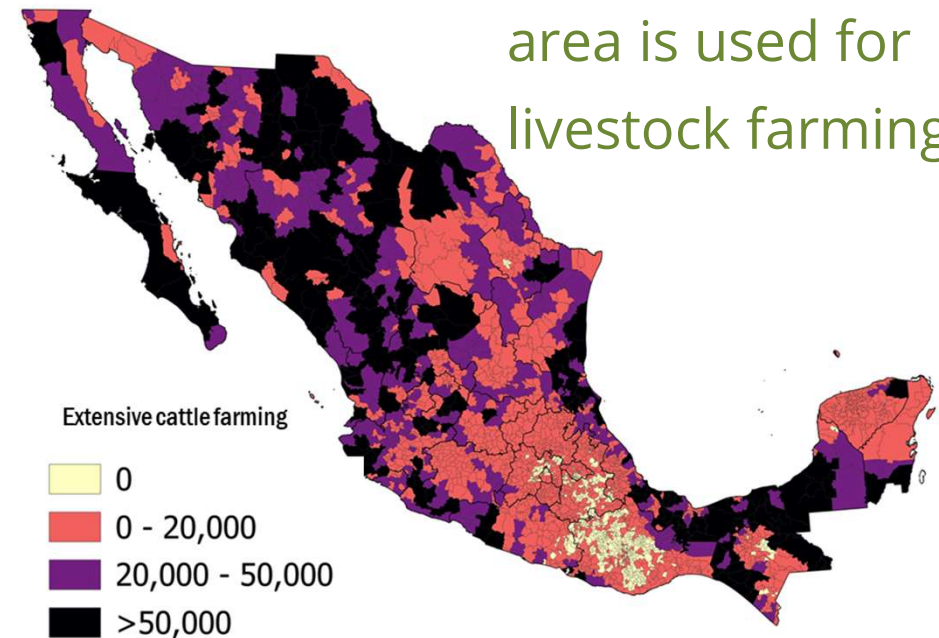
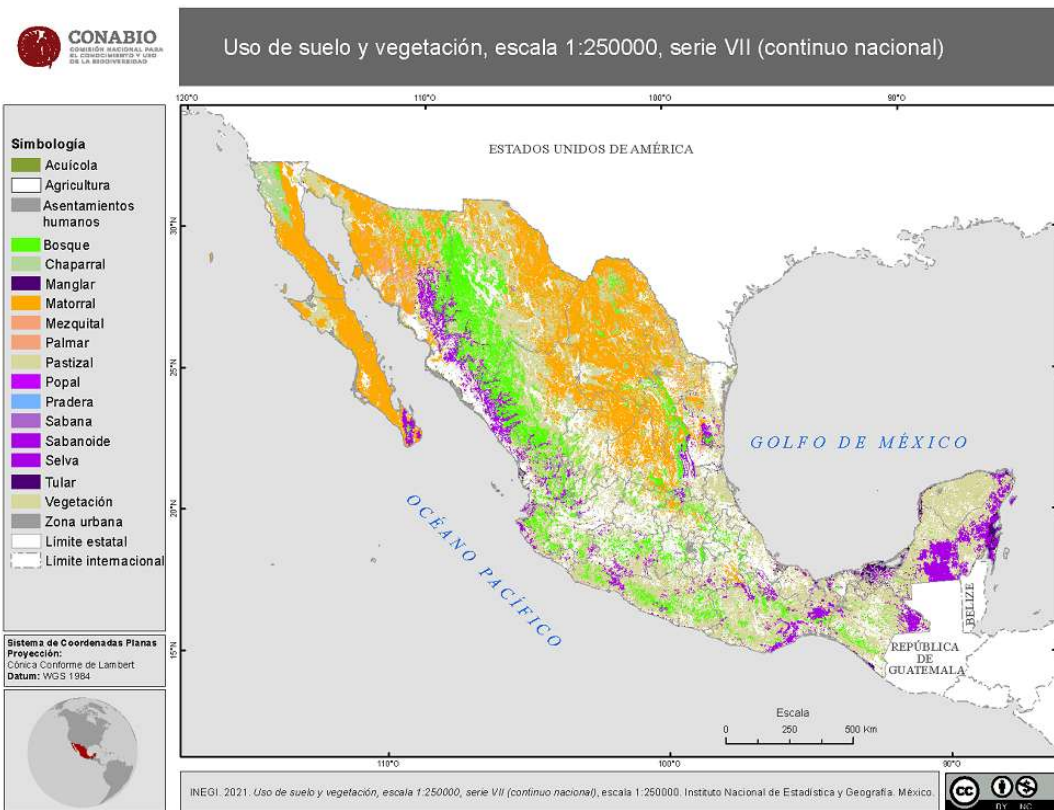

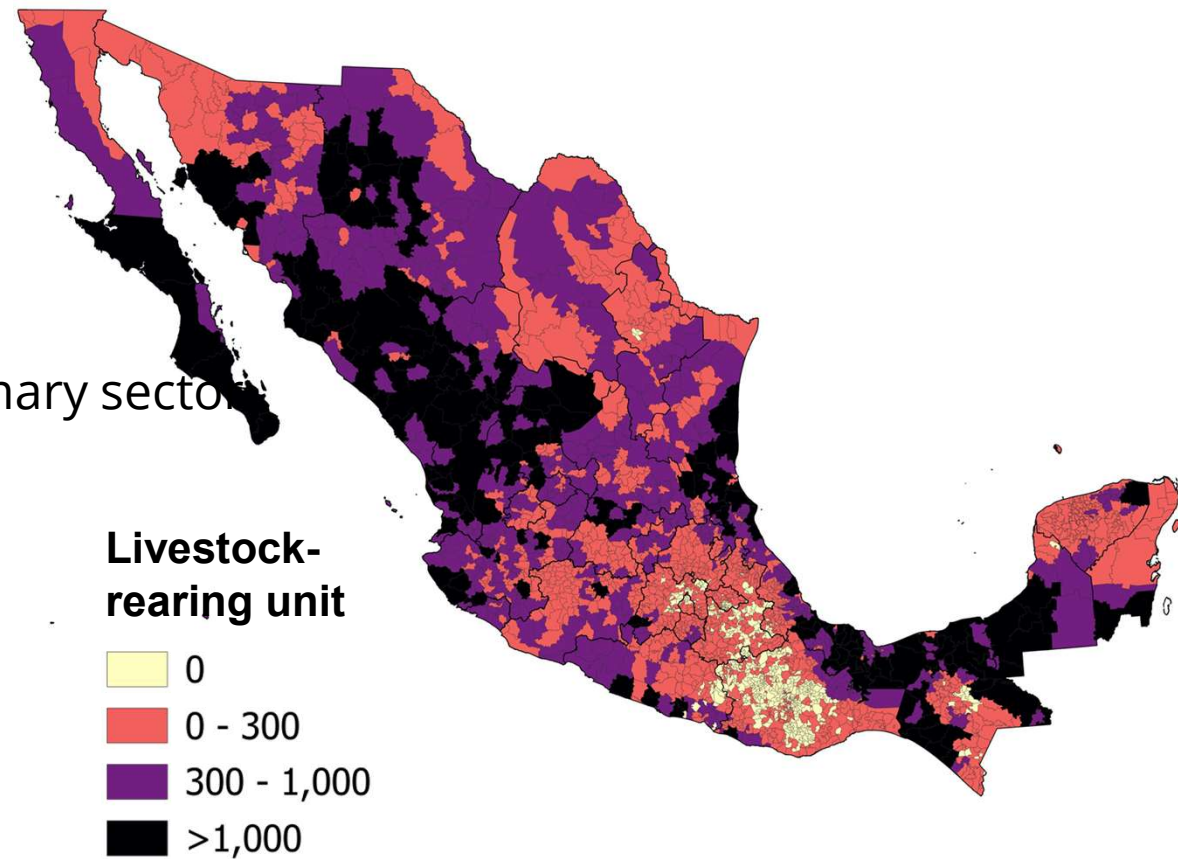
The Challenge: Why Rangelands Matter in Mexico

- 56% of the country's surface area is used for livestock farming.



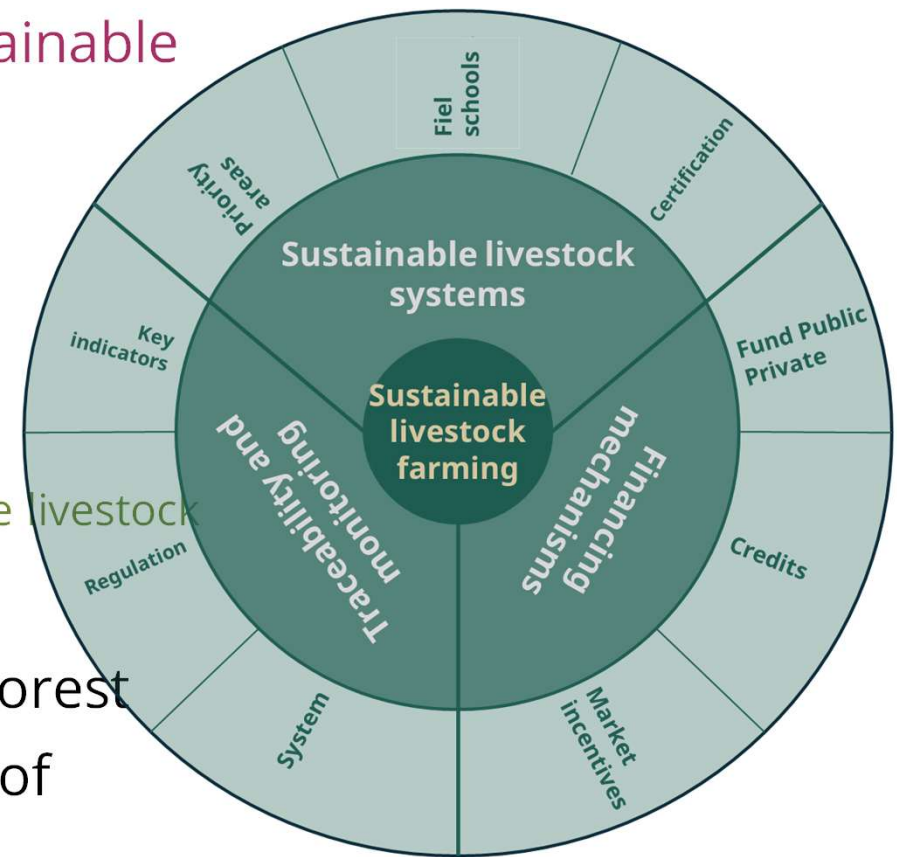
Key stakeholders affected by rangeland degradation

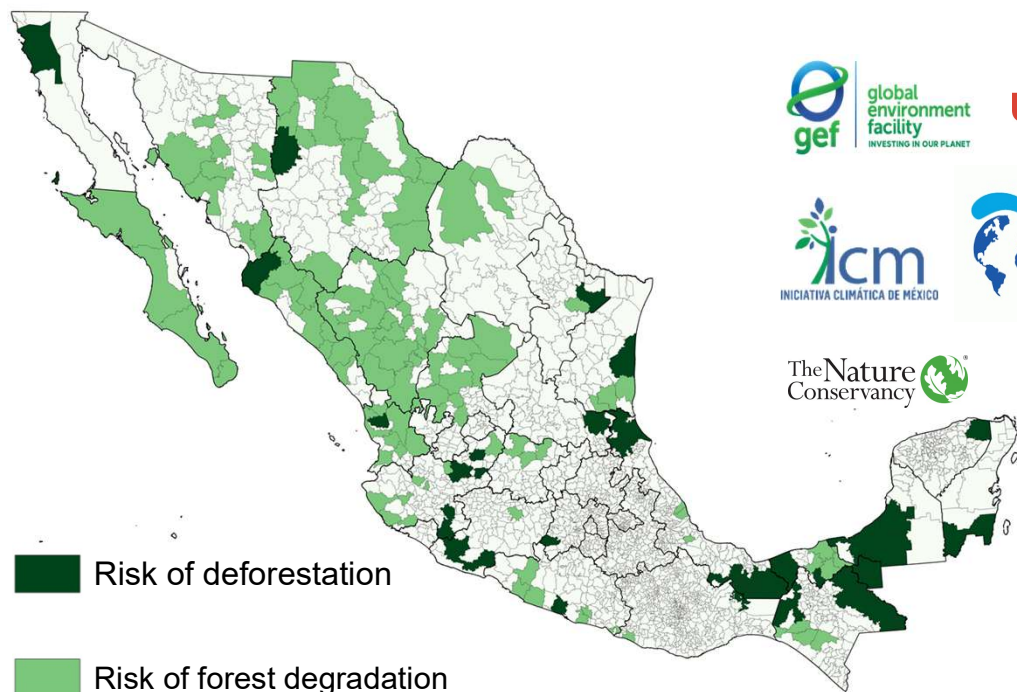
Our Policy Response: Mexico's National Rangeland Strategy & Integration into LDN

- Policy adopted: National Strategy for Sustainable Livestock Farming
- Key commitments:
 1. Transition to sustainable livestock systems
 2. Financing mechanisms
 3. Traceability and monitoring of deforestation-free livestock farming
- Link to LDN: Reducing deforestation and forest degradation through the implementation of sustainable systems

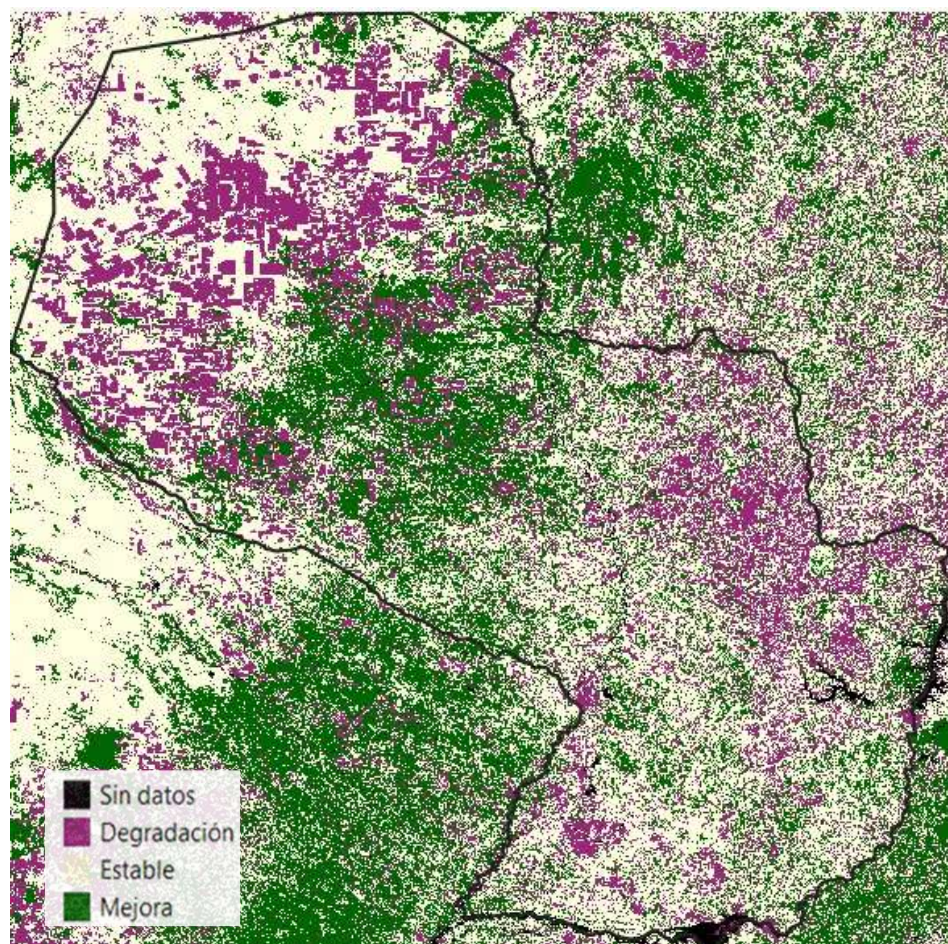

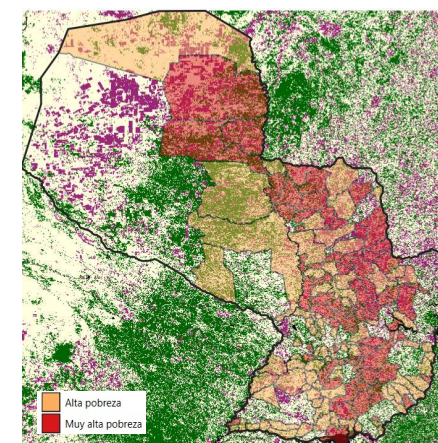

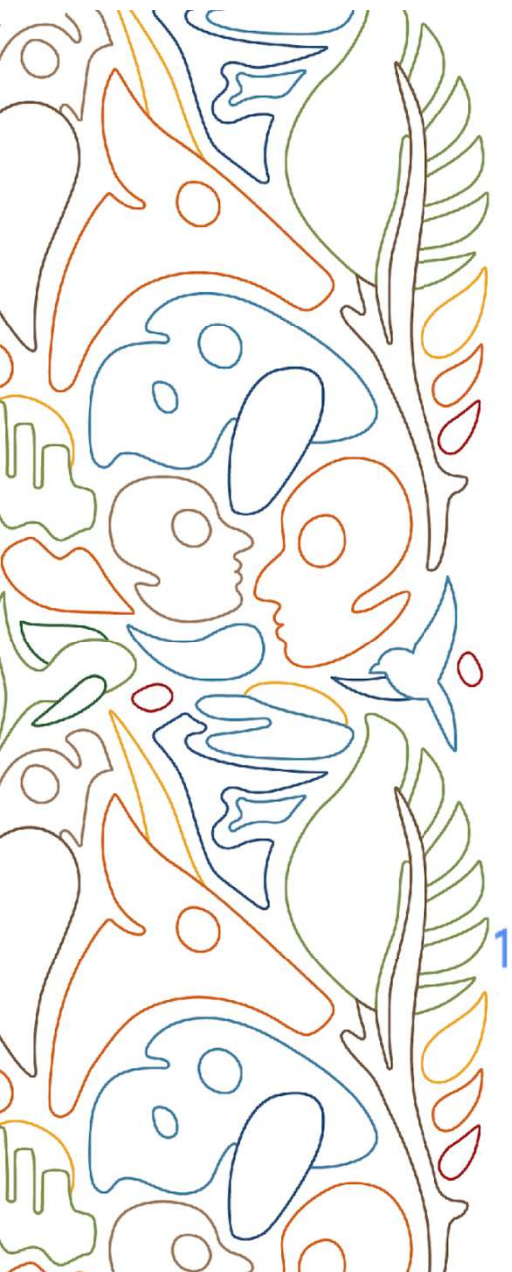
